

Hymn of the Month: PUER NOBIS NASCITUR

PUER NOBIS NASCITUR, usually translated as "Unto Us Is Born A Son" is a medieval hymn tune for Christmas found in the 14th Century German *Moosburg Gradual* and the 15th Century *Trier Manuscript*. The *Moosburg Gradual* contains many melodies derived from 12th and 13th Century manuscripts of the Notre Dame de Paris *organum* repertoire, suggesting that Puer Nobis Nascitur's antiquity might be much greater.

The tune was first published in the 1582 Finnish Songbook *Piae Cantionnes*, a source of 74 medieval songs collected by Jaakko Suomalainen, a Finnish Lutheran cleric, and published by the Catholic printer T. P. Rutha. The tune's setting in hymnody is most closely associated with the prolific German composer and theorist Michael Praetorius (composer of the well-known "Lo How A Rose E'er Blooming). The carol became popular as a processional hymn following a translation by George Ratcliffe Woodward first published in 1902. Percy Dearmer also translated the hymn for inclusion in *The Oxford Book of Carols* (1928) as "Unto Us a Boy Is Born". Both translations are commonly used.

Settings of this tune to various texts appear in our own *Glory to God* hymnal five times:

Hymn #67 (a setting of Psalm 89), #152 What Star is This That Beams So Bright, #254 That Easter Day with Joy Was Bright, #487 These Treasured Children (a setting for Baptism), and #666 O Splendor of God's Glory Bright. All settings occurring within Glory to God are in D major, with an alternate voicing of parts used for hymn #67. The arch of beautiful melody is particularly stirring and allows the organist the opportunity to "solo out" the melody from the other voice parts (alto tenor and bass) by utilizing a solo stop on the organ (usually a reed stop such as Dulcian, Trumpet, Crohhorn, or Oboe).

The meter of syllables, known as "LM" stands for "Long Meter" whereby each stanza is noted as 8.8.8.8. There are about 63 hymns in our *Glory to God* hymnal with this metrical number, including the well-known Doxology.
